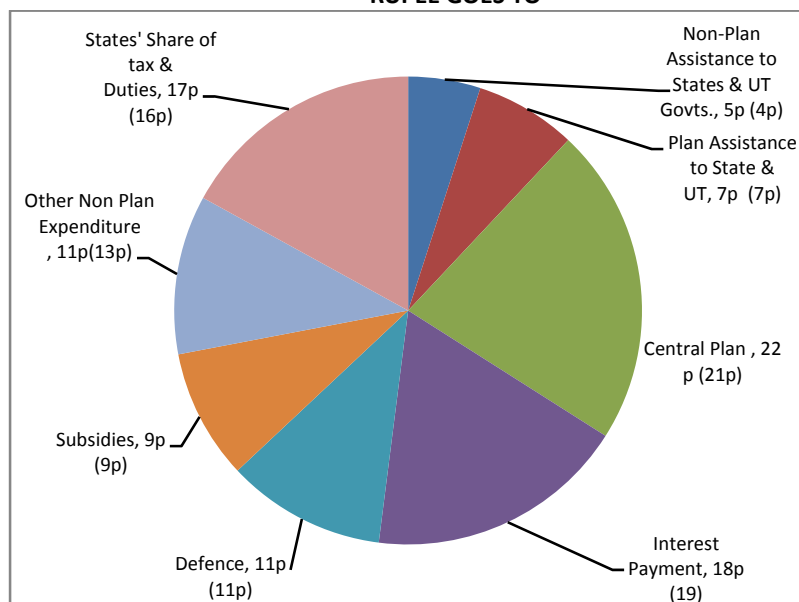

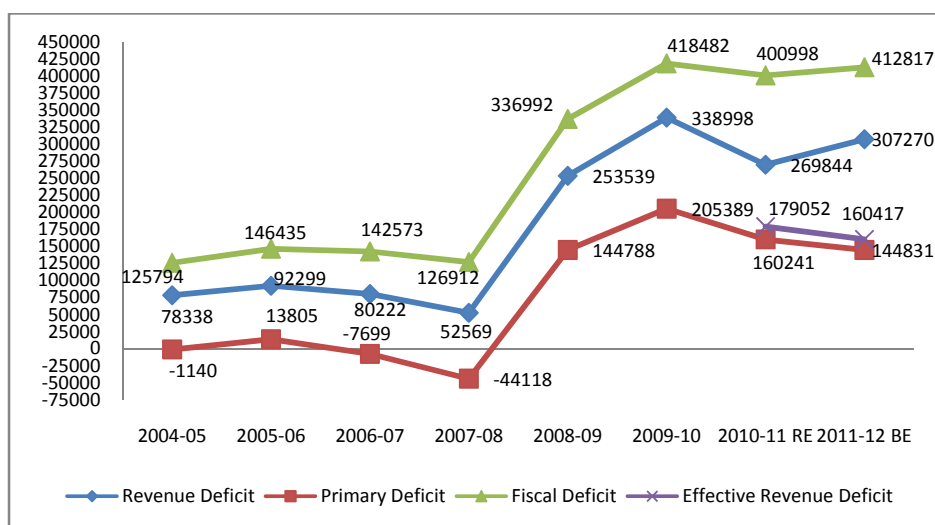

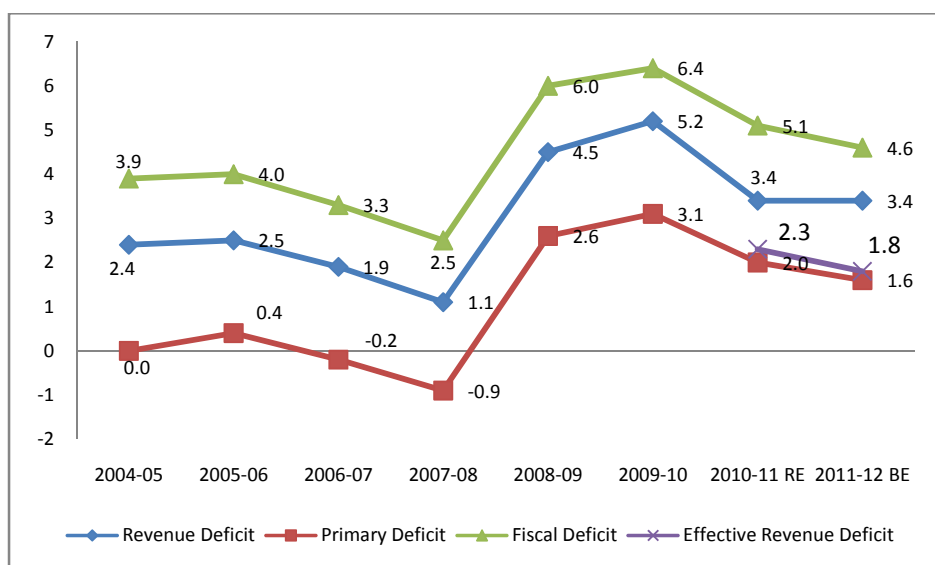

AS A PERCENTAGE OF GDP



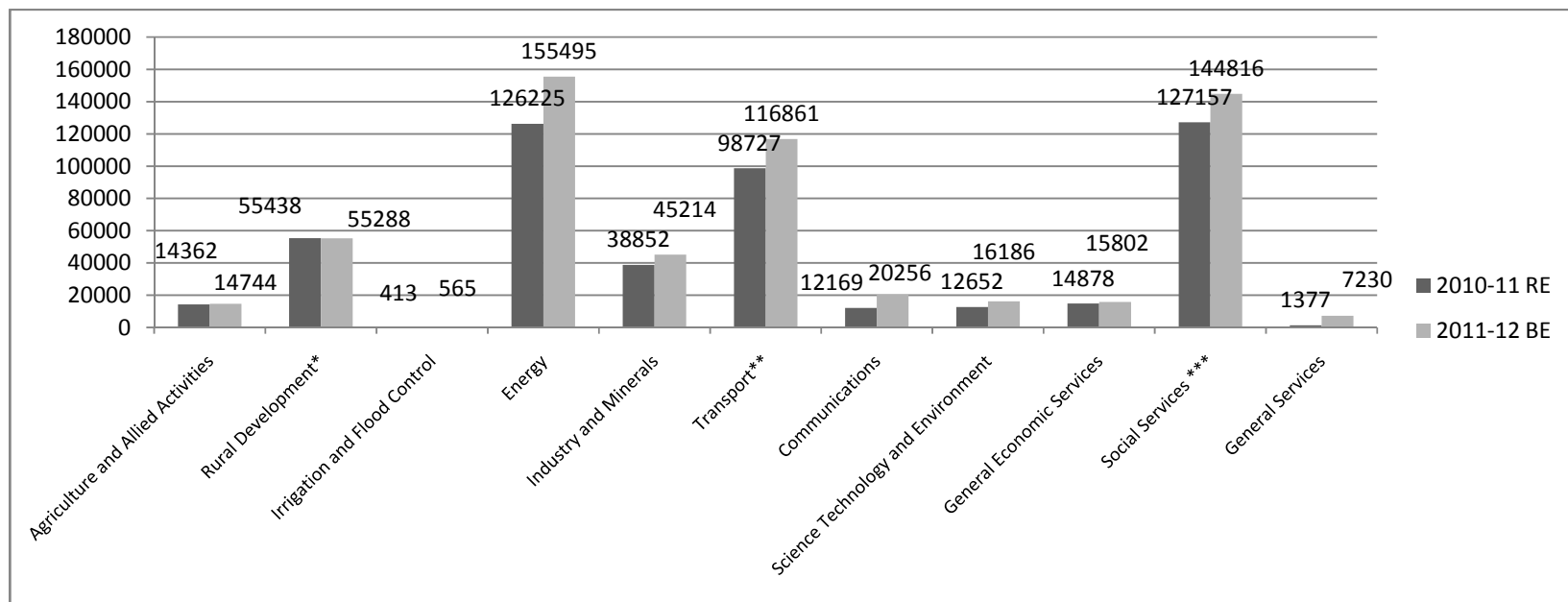
Deficits have been calculated on the basis of the following estimates of GDP
